
The Curse of the School Rabbit




Moving On Up

WARWICKSHIRE HOUSEHOLD SUPPORT FUND



Help with energy and heating costs: This scheme is now open

Before you apply Does your household . . .

- Live in the following district council areas Warwick, Stratford-upon-Avon, Rugby, Nuneaton and Bedworth or North Warwickshire?
- 2. Have a combined gross household income of no more than £31,000.00 per year?
- 3. Have **no** household savings?
- 4. Have someone living with a vulnerability?

If your household satisfies each of the 4 criteria above, you can apply for support through the Warwickshire Household Support Fund provided you have not applied for the same support in the previous 6 months.

Vulnerability What do we mean by vulnerability?

- Long term diagnosed and treated health conditions e.g., COPD
- Households with unmanageable debt
- Pregnant
- Disabled and in receipt of DLA or PIP
- In receipt of free school meals
- Other vulnerabilities disclosed by household's not on the list but accepted at AOE's discretion

What's available? So what help may be available to you?

Subject to funding and eligibility criteria, this fund could offer qualifying residents across the county of Warwickshire one the following:

- 1. Financial support toward current energy debts only
- 2. Assistance to repair or replace broken boilers and heating systems

1. Financial support towards Energy Debts only - subject to funding

This is open to the following utility types:

- Electricity Gas
 - This will require the applicant to:
- 1. Complete a separate paper application form for debt relief (to be provided by Act on Energy after online self-certification application is submitted.)
- 2. Provide evidence to Act on Energy supporting their application (the evidence required will be explained in the paper application form).
- 3. Agree & accept that at the discretion of the Household Support Fund Team it may be a condition of assistance that you are referred to a debt advice service (Step Change) to assist you with budgeting and debt management.

2. Assistance to repair, service and replace broken boilers and heating systems - subject to funding This support is only offered to the following tenures of housing:

- Owner Occupiers:
- Must have owned the property for a minimum of 12 months.
- The property must not be on the market for sale or due to go on the market for sale.
 - Shared Ownership households who have a contracted duty to repair:
- Must have owned the property for a minimum of 12 months.
- The property must not be on the market for sale or due to go on the market for sale.
 - Long term private rented tenants who have a contracted duty to repair.

This support is open to heating systems of all fuel types and covers the following:

- Replacement of boilers (all fuel types) beyond economic repair / or replacement of parts/ repair.
- Replacement or repair of other types of heating systems e.g. storage heaters
- Installation of first-time heating systems where a gas supply is present
- Replacement of broken warm air systems to gas fired wet radiator systems
- Repair/ replacement/ installation of standard or smart heating controls
- Servicing
 - This will require the applicant to both:
- 1. Complete a separate paper application form (to be provided by Act on Energy after online self-certification application is submitted.)
- 2. Provide evidence to Act on Energy supporting their application (the evidence required will be explained in the paper application form).

How to apply? Before registering your interest, please note:

- 1. There is **no guarantee of support**.
- 2. This is **not an emergency scheme**.
- 3. If you were successful in receiving support through the previous Warwickshire Household Support Fund, you can apply again provided you made your application over 6 months ago. If you received help more recently your application will be ignored. Priority will be given to households that have made no previous application.

- Supported internships are unpaid and typically last 6-12 months, with the interns being full immersed at the employer's premises
- In addition to the jobs the interns will do, they will complete a personalised study programme including subjects such as
 English, Maths and can achieve other qualifications such as City in Guilds Planning for Progression and Career Planning. This
 is delivered by the education partner.
- · Interns are supported by qualified job coaches to enable them to become as independent as possible within their roles.







- Working Tax Credit run-on-paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)


