After his lesson this week an inspired Riley, supported by George, went on to create further amazing art work, well done both!






## Sam Plants a Sunflower


ideal for newly confident readers and are the perfect length for reading aloud at bedtime or in the classroom.

# 7 STEPS TO HELP SUPPORT YOUR CHILD IN THINKING ABOUT THEIR FUTURE

- 1) Sit down and discuss interests and likes (that can be in or out of school!)
- 2) Encourage exploring different job sectors and roles based on their interests
- 3) Encourage your child to think about their values and strengths e.g. what is important to them.



- 4) Explore different routes into jobs and skills e.g. apprenticeships, colleges routes and Universities. Consider more than one path or option.
- 5) Speak to trusted adults at home or at school (e.g. Family Footings Team/ Tutor/ Teacher)
- 6) Think about what next steps might look like e.g. course providers and qualifications
- 7) Support your child to gain experience (this could be through work experience or volunteering)



# **HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND FOOD (HAF)**

Amazing news for the future of the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) **Programme** 

The HAF team is delighted to confirm that HAF has been extended for a further year and will now run until March 2026, meaning Warwickshire will be running HAF activities during Spring 25, Summer 25 and Winter 25. As a reminder, HAF does not currently run during half term holidays, meaning the next HAF delivery period will be over the Easter holidays. The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme is funded by the Department for Education (DfE) to provide young people who are in full-time education (Reception to Year 11) and eligible for benefits-related free school meals with access to enriching activities and meals, for free, during the three main school holidays - Winter, Spring and Summer:





# INDEPENDENT TRAVEL TRAINING

Do you know a young person (11-25) with SEND and an EHCP who is eager and enthusiastic, who might benefit from **FREE** Independent Travel Training?

Independent travel training offers one to one, tailored, practical support to help young people with SEND learn to travel independently their school/college/work placement/training provider by using public transport within Warwickshire.

## Training is tailored to the individual needs and will offer:

- 1:1 personalised travel trainer support
- Road and personal safety skills

- Journey planning
- Emergency strategies around travel

These skills can then be transferred into their everyday lives and future enabling them to access more opportunities such as going out with friends, transitioning to college, work placements etc. It can also benefit parents and carers, giving them peace of mind that their child or young person is able to travel safely on their own.

The young person must be a Warwickshire resident, have an Education, Health and Care Plan and be between the ages of 11-25. You can <u>find the full criteria and application form online here.</u>

This only takes a couple of minutes to complete. Once a referral is submitted one of our team will be in touch to discuss the next steps.

Journeys must be from the young person's home to their school/college/work placement/training provider by using public transport within Warwickshire. Before a referral can be made, prior consent must be given by the individual, or the parent/carer if the individual is under 16 years old.
